*How we used our Pupil Premium Allocation in 2015-16*

*Pupil Premium*

Streetsbrook received a total Pupil Premium allocation of £5,340 in 2015-16. This was based on the number of children in our school who were eligible for Free School Meals (FSM). We used the additional funding in a number of ways including:

- Targeted intervention in Reception: Language Link, Phonics, Mathematics & Time to Talk
- Targeted intervention in Year 1: ELS (Early Literacy support), 1-1 Reading, Mathematics, Smart Moves & Social Group
- Targeted intervention in Year 2 : Phonics, Mathematics, Social Group, 1-1 Reading
- Working with the Synergy Collaborative on 'best practice'
- Enabling access to extended school provision e.g. After School clubs
- Subsidising/contributing towards educational visits including Residential trips

The impact that this had on the achievement of those children is tabled below:

In 2016-17, we will receive a Pupil Premium allocation of £17,580. This amount is based on the numbers in the table below.

Pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant are identified in each year group and tracked on a termly basis. Targeted support is put into place to ensure that their attainment and progress is in line with Non Pupil Premium children.

If you are currently in receipt of one of the following:

**Qualifying Benefits:**

- Income Support
  - Jobseeker's Allowance -income-based (JSA)
  - Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- If you receive both income-based and contribution-based JSA/ESA you should still qualify if the amounts you receive are the same or if income-based part is higher. If however, contribution-based part is higher you will not qualify**
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an income that does not exceed £16,190
  - Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
  - Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
  - Universal Credit (Evidence of this benefit will be required)
  - Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit (Please note this is a temporary qualification and we will need to be able to verify this entitlement)

Solihull Council will be able to identify if Streetsbrook Infant & Nursery School will qualify for extra funding which can be spent on various activities including extra tuition, sports and music. It can also be used to subsidise/pay for your child's school trips which include Residential trips.

You can apply directly online, alternatively you can download a **free school meal benefit/universal infant free school meal form** or collect a form from your child's school.

Completed forms should be returned to school or during school holidays to the address found on the form. If your application for free school meals is approved you will not need to re-apply each year unless your circumstances change.
