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


Spring Term Topic, 1st half-term: 'Making a Difference'

Working to Keep our Children Safe in 2018

A New Year, and what better time to remind ourselves of an important road safety issue.

A bright banner has been displayed outside school and we are re-launching a campaign to make everyone aware that outside Streetsbrook we advocate:

- A Voluntary 20mph Zone
- A Voluntary No Turning Zone

(Please use areas away from the school vicinity to turn safely)

These two simple measures are proven to reduce the chances of an accident occurring and should only add seconds to your journey.



Parental Help

We continue to ask for parental help during the day and welcome mums, dads, grandparents or childminders, so if you are able to help, we really do value your support. A DBS Check is required (please see a member of staff for further information).

Riding of Bicycles and Scooters

We are pleased to encourage the children to walk or cycle to school, but would like to remind you of the procedure for using bicycles or scooters on school premises. For the safety of everyone, in order to avoid accidents, all children must dismount at the school gates and push their scooters and bicycles to the area where they are kept during the day. Similarly, at the end of the day, the children are to push their bicycles/scooters outside the school gates before riding them. The children are regularly reminded about this in school.

Attendance

We are only too aware that at this time of year, a number of 'bugs' are usually caught by the children which can affect their attendance. However, with the exception of genuine illness it is crucial for your child's education that they attend school every day.

Below is a table reporting the attendance of each class for the Autumn Term.

Attendance figures are analysed by the school and the Local Authority on a regular basis. Attendance is also inspected by Ofsted. Therefore the Governors and staff would appreciate your commitment in ensuring our attendance is as good as it possibly can be. In order for attendance to be judged by Ofsted as 'high', the overall attendance of children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 has to be above 95.7%. Well done to Year 2 for exceeding this requirement!

In line with our Attendance Policy, we will be soon be sending out attendance letters as part of our commitment to working with you and your child in raising attendance. Attending school regularly and on time has a positive impact on learning, progress and therefore the best life chances for pupils. Research shows that attendance and punctuality are the single most important factors in school success.

Recorders


All children in Year 2 will be having recorder lessons after February half-term. Each child will need to practise at home and will therefore require a recorder and practise book of their own.

Some children may already have a recorder and possibly a book too, but if not you may wish to order this yourself, perhaps through Amazon. If you would like us to order one for you with one of our supplies, we are more than happy to do so, prices below.

The book we will be using is entitled 'Recorder from the Beginning' book 1. You may buy the book with or without the CD that provides examples of the music to be played, along with backing tracks for your son/daughter to use as an accompaniment when practising at home.

If you wish to order via school, your choices are listed below:

The facility to purchase these items will be visible on ParentPay from today. This will be available until Friday 2 February. We would be very grateful if you could remind your child to bring and keep their recorder and book in their book bags at all times, as music lessons will not be a set day each week.

Trashion Show

This term will include a Trashion Show on **Tuesday 6 February at 9.45am** here at Streetsbrook, where children will parade in costumes they have made from recyclable materials at home – please feel free to support your child in beginning to make their costume as soon as possible. We are delighted that the Mayor will be joining us - further details will be sent in due course.

Winter Clothing

With the cold weather now with us we would very much appreciate your support in helping the children to be appropriately dressed.

- please ensure your son/daughter brings a warm coat to school, preferably with a hood, as they still love to take part in outdoor activities at this time of the year and we want to ensure they remain warm
- gloves/mittens are perfect for outdoor play, but most children find it easier to manage mittens. Please bear this in mind and help to make your son/daughter's life easier!
- wellington boots are desirable on wet and snowy days

In order to try to minimise lost items please ensure everything is labelled appropriately with your son/daughter's name. Thank you for your help with this matter.

Head Lice

At the end of last term, we were informed of a couple of cases of head lice and I am grateful to the parents of these children concerned for notifying us of this. In order to try and keep this problem to a minimum we should be grateful if parents would act upon the following advice:

- Children should be encouraged to brush or comb their hair several times each day. This will damage any lice present and inhibit the laying of eggs (nits)
- It is helpful if parents examine their children's hair at least weekly. Nits are found firmly glued to the hair shaft, usually very near the scalp. They should not be confused with dandruff, which is freely moving
- If everyone examines and treats their child if infected, we can eradicate this problem
- Consult your local pharmacy for the current recommended treatment.

Voluntary Contributions

Education in the UK is funded by the state for all children unless parents choose to opt out of the system and make alternative arrangements for their child. The level of funding provided by the state ensures a basic level of education is available to all. At Streetsbrook, we know that children benefit hugely from an education that is enriched by a range of practical activities, including welcoming visitors into school and weekly swimming lessons. However, these additional activities cost money over and above the level of funding provided by the state. This terms voluntary contributions will be being used to fund our trip to the Council House, a range of enrichment activities for Book Day, Science Week, our D&T project of fabric bunting and weekly swimming lessons.

A very sincere thank you to all of you who continue to support the school by paying these contributions. Without your continued support school would not be able to fund these additional activities. The amounts for the spring term are £1.50 weekly, £10.50 for this first half term and £7.50 for the second half term, or should you choose to pay the term in full £18.00.

Payments can be made via ParentPay in the usual way (please choose the appropriate option you are paying). If you are experiencing any problems with ParentPay, please contact the school office.
