Thank you to all who donated textiles last week. We made a very healthy £198 - a super result!



YEAR 1

In English this week we have continued our work on our non-fiction books and the children have shared some brilliant facts about different animals. Next week we are moving on to discuss glossaries and will be sorting words in to alphabetical order, this might be something that you wish to practise with your child at home. In Maths we have been focusing on number bonds and subtraction facts within 20. The children have been helping Rob the Robot to find his missing numbers, and he will be sending some more problems home for this week's homework!

In our PSHE lessons this half-term we are discussing our Dreams and Goals, and the children will be working with a partner to design and decorate a wellie. They will then be planted up and displayed in a whole school 'Garden of Dreams and Goals'. Do you have any old

YEAR 2

Our poetry learning has continued this week, including annotating and recording our thoughts and feelings about the poem 'Friends' by Abbie Farwell Brown. The children have really enjoyed picking up the key elements of the poem, such as rhyming, structure, spotting adjectives and adverbs and even personification! We have also been learning about food chains as part of our Habitats learning in Science, with some children making paper chains to reflect the order of producers to consumers in their food chain.
