

Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday 6th February the children at celebrated 'Safer Internet Day'. This year's theme was focused on encouraging the children to: 'Create, Connect and Share Respect' whenever they use the internet. The whole school took part in some wonderful and exciting activities that encouraged them to reflect on how great the internet is but also the precautions that they need to take to keep safe whilst online.

In Nursery and Childcare, the children were introduced to 'Smartie the Penguin.' Children reflected on who could help them if they experienced a problem when online or using computers/iPads. In Reception, the children listened to a few stories including 'Once Upon a Time Online' and 'Troll Stinks.' They shared circle-time discussions about the key messages in the books and

discussed the reasons why set rules are important

and need to be followed.





Within KS1, the children completed an activity where they had to work as a team to create a poster that explained what they liked about Streetsbrook. Using the Seesaw app, the children were encouraged to write and post positive comments about a group poster. We discussed how the positive comments made us feel and emphasised the importance of treating people with respect online as well as offline. The children also listened stories such as 'Webster's Email' and took part in-depth circle-time discussions.

Many thanks for your support with emphasising the importance of staying safe whilst online at home too. The children went on to write a recount of Hal's adventure to Space using time words such as first, next and last. In Maths we have been exploring the concept of half by sharing into two equal groups. We then went on to read the story 'The Doorbell Rang' by Pat Hutchins and looked at sharing equally using the context of this story. Linked to our topic 'Out of this world' we have been looking at the painting 'A Starry Night' by Van Gogh. The children have created their own textured paintings inspired by this work.

On Tuesday it was Safer Internet Day - we hope you have had the chance to discuss with your child the key learning they have taken away from these activities. Next week as our fabulous finale to this half terms topic, we are looking forward to a Skype question and answer session with Dr. Dhara Patel, Education Officer from the Royal Observatory Greenwich. 


Little Stars have enjoyed singing '5 Little Speckled Frogs' and have created some of our very own frogs.
