Happy days past and present and Happy Birthday Streetsbrook!

The celebrations culminated on Friday after a week of celebrations.

We had hoped to have a street party with parents, staff and children but the fine September days of last year were not to forecast for the 29 September 2017 this year! Never to be beaten, the party moved indoors with Reception and Nursery classes in the hall and Years 1 & 2 in their classrooms. A 60th picnic for each child had been prepared by the kitchen staff and parents were welcomed to join their children. There was a real buzz around school which had been decorated resplendently by the children along with balloons and decorations in our school colours adding a celebratory feel. The children were so excited and as you can see the parents obviously enjoyed their 60th picnic too, even though most were sitting on infant chairs for their lunch.

Following lunch, parents departed and the hall was transformed with balloons and memorabilia of the past six decades including many photographs of past staff. We were therefore delighted to welcome some of them to our celebration assembly in this the school's 60th year. Mrs Minter hosted the event and the children performed songs and dances over the past sixty years.

It was particularly exciting to have the first female pupil join us, who started on the first day of the school opening in 1957. The school cost £42,000 to build, compared to the building extension of 2009 which cost £1.5 million!

Delphine Quiney is listed on the original register that was displayed in the hall. Delphine recounted her special memories and her love for the school all those years ago under the headship of Miss Appleby. Mrs Blakely followed for approximately 6 years and then Kay-Luther Jones became Head for over 20 years. Mrs Minter, who was the Deputy at that time, became Headteacher in 2007 to bring us right up to date here in 2017.

We were delighted to welcome Mrs Luther-Jones to school and she was joined by other ex staff and present governors on this auspicious day. Mrs Dorothy Tongue was also present who, since 1963, has worked at Streetsbrook, been a parent and now still continues to help by listening to readers. The visitors loved seeing the children perform and the finale of the cutting of the special cake made by our own Miss Dorow.

Children enjoyed their own class cake as the culmination of the celebrations came to a close and memories were made that will be shared once again as the school moves into the 7th Decade2027.

The future of Streetsbrook is in good hands and the last 60 years has seen so many children and adults pass through its doors - what amazing memories the school could tell.



YEAR 1

We have had another busy week in Year 1! In English we have been learning and writing lists. Maybe your child could help you to write a shopping list for the weekend?



Next week the children will be reading the story of the Little Match Girl and using lots of descriptive language in their writing.

Our Maths learning this week has been focused on number bonds and we have been investigating which numbers make 10. Next week will see us applying our learning to a variety of addition and subtraction problems.



We have also been rehearsing for the Harvest Festival and can't wait to share our songs with those of you who are able to attend on Tuesday. If you are available to help with walking the children to and from the church, and haven't already, could you please speak to a member of staff. We will be leaving straight after registration and should be back in time for lunch. We hope that you have a lovely weekend!

RECEPTION



This week in Reception the children have been helping Peg Leg Sam, the pirate to design a new flag for his pirate ship. Working with a given set of criteria, the children have designed some amazing flags. All of them include a repeating pattern of 2D shapes. We have also helped Peg Leg Sam solve his treasure problem and work out how to share it fairly with his friends.



During writing sessions we have been applying our phonics by segmenting simple words (using our sound robot voice), writing the sounds we can hear and blending the sounds together again to read what we have written. In PSHE the children have been exploring the idea of 'Working as a team' and discussing ways to resolve conflicts with our play. Next week we will be exploring the concept of floating and sinking.

The children will be making their junk model boats on Monday and Tuesday. If you have any junk that we could use please send this in. Thank you to those parents who have sent in observations from home relating to physical development. This will influence our assessment of the children's abilities.

Note: Due to the Harvest Festival taking place next Tuesday, R2 will be swimming Monday Morning. Please could all children bring their swimming kits on Monday Morning. Thank you

Little Stars have had a great time exploring the woodland area this week, collecting leaves, twigs and conkers for our 'seasons' board. YEAR 2



This week, our work about Florence Nightingale has continued, with us learning to write in the first person to visualise what it was like to be her. We imagined writing a letter to her parents, using 'I, me and my' instead of 'she and her'. All week in Maths, our focus has been on addition, using a variety of strategies that can help us.

We've learnt by drawing the tens and ones in a number, it can really help, which we've done whilst using early column addition practical grids.
